President's update

St. Vladimir Institute held its 2021 semi-annual general meeting of members on Sunday, June 13 at 2 p.m. The online event featured a variety of reports from board members as well as a brief tribute and a moment of silence for members who have passed away in recent years. Following is an excerpt from the address presented by Alla Shklar during the meeting.



I would like to highlight the Institute's progress over the past year. It has been a challenge. The COVID-19 pandemic has been a reality for the past 16 months, yet, with solid governance from the board of directors, dedicated staff, general goodwill within, and your financial and moral generosity, we have managed to circumvent disaster and keep the lights on.

We developed a five-year strategic plan, redefining our goals, strengthening our financial situation, engaging in community relations, continuing cultural/educational programming, and moving forward with ambitious redevelopment plans.

COVID-19 forced SVI to quickly adapt to new rules. Our building was locked to the public; all indoor, in-person events were cancelled; and health and safety protocols with social distancing were immediately enacted. Only our executive director, administrator and residence chefs were physically present every day to oversee operations.

Our principal source of revenue (student residents) dropped from a full house of 46 residents to 18 residents. To offset financial losses, we were forced to lay off three employees, cut back on kitchen staff, initiate government assistance, and work with a skeleton staff.

This year, an investment committee was struck to instate policy and procedures that will ensure SVI's future financial stability.

I introduced bi-monthly virtual roundtable discussions with our in-house organizations to find common ground in our marketing strategies, and discussed with them the creation of a Ukraine Global Centre of Visual History and Education as a centralized virtual teaching and learning resource delivered through an integrated online platform, (a proposal submitted by our former board member Orest Sushko). The response thus far has been positive and our meeting will continue.

Despite the road blocks, we regrouped, reshuffled the board of directors, and with

trepidation and determination launched the first virtual Malanka in January 2021. With 133 ticket purchasers, the festive event raised \$16,000 with the help of our sponsors. That success translated into a six-month virtual cultural program initiated by our board members Halyna Perun, Adrianne Hordienko Hewryk and Maxym Tarnawsky, and volunteer Karen Yarmol-Franko.

The redevelopment committee worked steadily to prepare the business and master plan RFPs for consulting firms who will submit feasibility studies by year's end.

SVI has survived. Life is slowly returning to a "new normal." Applications to our student residence are trickling in; Ukrainian language classes are continuing; theatre and auditorium bookings are being penciled in.

I believe St. Vladimir Institute is at a crossroads. It can no longer rest on its past laurels. It must move forward, re-visualize itself, and seep back into the community's conscience. It must once again become the hub of innovation, academic discourse, artistic creativity, and preserve our Ukrainian heritage amidst the Canadian landscape. We are the only Ukrainian community building still standing in Toronto's downtown academic/cultural corridor.

As always, I am forever grateful to my executive committee: Tania Washchuk, Michael Kalimin and Mark Olynyk; to my present board of directors, our staff, volunteers, and particularly to our outgoing executive director, Sonia Holiad, who truly kept the ship afloat amidst the stormy COVID waters; and lastly to you, our dear members, for the patience, generosity and support that you have so willingly given us.

SVI Investment Advisory Committee presents its policy

Recently, the SVI Board of Directors approved an investment policy presented by the members of the Investment Advisory Committee: Roman Dubczak, Ivan Franko, Michael Kalimin (chair), and Bohdan Leshchyshen.

The investment policy governs the investment of SVI's endowment fund and scholarship fund. Its goal is to ensure that the assets of these funds, together with their earnings, are invested in a prudent manner so the funds will be sufficient to support the disbursement objectives of St Vladimir Institute.

The funds will be invested by independent investment advisors or managers and monitored by the Investment Advisory Committee. The committee will meet quarterly with the investment advisor or manager to review the assets, the net cash flow and performance of the funds, the current economic outlook and investment strategies, and to take any action necessary to ensure compliance with the policy. Annually, the advisor or manager will provide a summary of the total trading activity, and the committee will review the investment policy.
